Case Summary

Janice Paluzzi, a resident of Hanover, Massachusetts, filed a lawsuit against multiple companies, including Johnson & Johnson (J&J), Johnson & Johnson Consumer Inc., and several other defendants, claiming that the use of talcum powder products caused her to develop mesothelioma. Her complaint was filed on Sept. 27, 2021, in the Middlesex Superior Court, Massachusetts, stating that the talcum powder products were contaminated with <u>asbestos</u>.

Paluzzi alleged that she had used J&J's talcum powder products, specifically Johnson's Baby Powder and Shower to Shower, daily from childhood, and that this exposure caused her illness. She was diagnosed with mesothelioma in 2021, and the jury saw her testimony via a deposition video dated July 2022. Her attorney argued for \$ 25 million in damages for past pain and suffering, emphasizing that their client's condition was terminal.

The trial featured arguments regarding the source of Paluzzi's exposure to <u>asbestos</u>. While J&J argued that her exposure was due to her family's work environments, particularly at the John Hancock Building in Boston, where <u>asbestos</u> materials were present, Paluzzi's counsel relied on expert testimonies regarding the <u>asbestos</u> content in the J&J products and the qualitative analysis of her exposure.

In its defense, J&J contended there was inadequate evidence linking Paluzzi's usage of their talc products to her mesothelioma, pointing out that none of the bottles tested were those used by Paluzzi, and that her preferred brand

was Jean NatE. Despite these arguments, on June 18, 2025, the jury sided with Paluzzi, awarding her \$ 8 million in damages.

The verdict included \$ 5 million for past pain and suffering and \$ 3 million for future pain and suffering. The jury found that Paluzzi successfully demonstrated J&J's talcum powder contained <u>asbestos</u> and that a design defect significantly contributed to her mesothelioma. However, the jury did not find J&J liable for breaching the implied warranty of merchantability or negligent in providing inadequate warnings.

Award: \$8,000,000
